Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes

1. 2019 Road Projects

Mrs. Hoelzle referred Council to the Road Inventory schedule that was previously prepared. She offered project suggestions such as the Business Alley (Downtown), West Pointe Estates, Cherry Street from Church Street to Miller and Ashberry Farms. Possible funding sources could include OPWC Round 33 and the Permissive Tax Balance at Fulton County, current balance of \$167,343.39.

Council discussed moving the Mettabrook sewer separation project forward to accommodate repairing the road sooner.

2. Traffic Signal at Garfield Avenue and Main Street

It was discussed there could be a time frame when the traffic signal flashes red, starting at 11:00pm. It was also discussed, the 'NO TURN ON RED" signs need to be more visible.

3. Sanitary sewer extension - West Airport

Jones and Henry provided a rough estimate of extending the sewer 920 feet will cost approximately \$170,000 or \$14,000 for each of the 12 properties. Mr. Rose commented that he would like to see the sewer extended on Munson Road before a project is undertaken on West Airport.

4. Frozen Meters

The Public Service Division has discovered water meters that have not been properly maintained by property owners. This is usually the result of the homeowner requesting the water to be turned off and the pipes freezing. The Village has been replacing the meters at no cost to the property owner. Council discussed educating the public about this and providing information stating the Village will cover the cost of one meter during a predetermined time-frame, beyond that, the property owner will be responsible for the cost of replacing the meter.

5. Kabota Tractor

Councilman Pilliod inquired if the Village is in need of a Kabota Tractor. Mr. Schmidt passed away and his children would like to sell the tractor. Mr. Tedrow and Mr. Yackee will look at it.
