A New Procedure for Brush Pick Up

There are some changes planned for brush pick up. The Village of Swanton will continue brush pick up but the frequency will be changed beginning in 2019. Please see the schedule below for more details on the frequency of brush pick up. This change is the result of evaluating the service, over the past year, as it compares to the amount of staff. Other services such as park maintenance and sewer cleaning were affected by the amount of time spent on brush pick up. The new schedule will focus on the times of the year when the majority of properties will have an abundance of brush. Village officials reserve the right to not pick up brush that does not abide by the regulations set forth.

The Village is divided into four sections to correspond to one day of the week. During April and October, each section will be picked up four (4) times; once per week.

Monday: North of railroad tracks and West of Main Street

Tuesday: North of railroad tracks and East of Main Street

Wednesday: South of railroad tracks and West of Main Street

Thursday: South of railroad tracks and East of Main
Street



2019 Construction Season

At the time of writing this section of the newsletter, the asphalt plants had not opened yet but they will be soon!

2019 will be a busy year for construction, whether it be planning and design or actual construction.

Garfield Bridge replacement: This project is nearly complete. Once the asphalt plants open crews will be back to complete the outstanding sections on the bridge project and then pave the approaches.

Garfield Avenue resurfacing: Once the asphalt plants open (hoping mid April) the crew will be back out to pave the portion of Garfield Avenue from the bridge east to Main Street.

West Pointe resurfacing: The Village of Swanton will use Permissive Tax Funds to mill and fill the entire West Pointe subdivision. This is planned for summer 2019 and specific dates will be released once a contractor has been chosen.

Memorial Park Pavilion renovation: This project is scheduled in two phases (before and after Corn Festival). Minor renovations such as floor improvements and door replacements will occur before Corn Festival. The majority of renovations such as a fireplace and painting will occur after Corn Festival.

Project 10 Sewer Separation: This project must be operational by August 2020. The design is still ongoing with this project due to questions pertaining to Mary Wander Ditch and road improvements on Brookside, Woodside, and Parkside. The construction will occur in early 2020 in order to avoid an unforeseen issues and then having unimproved roads throughout the winter season.

Business and Dodge Alleys: Preliminary engineering and design will occur in 2019 with construction scheduled for Spring 2020. This is for the alley that runs North and South between Main Street and Lincoln Avenue from Zeiter Way and Church Street as well as the alley at runs from Main Street west to Dodge Street, just North of the railroad tracks.



Mosquito Spraying

Annual mosquito spraying is tentatively scheduled for the first week of June; please stay tuned for specific dates. Treatments after the initial spraying are based on weather and intensity of mosquito population. Employees are trained to safely and responsibly use pesticides to reduce mosquito numbers.

The vehicle used to conduct the spraying travels at about 10 mph and will have a sign identifying mosquito spraying in process.

No chemicals, oil, gas, ammunition, explosives, hazardous or toxic chemicals.

No refrigerators, air conditioners or any appliances containing Freon.

Election May 7, 2019

The Village of Swanton has two issues on the May 7, 2019 ballot. One is a 2 mil levy for the operation of the fire department and the second one is a 0.5 mil levy for park improvements. All residents of the Village of Swanton, age 18 and older, with earned income are required to file a Village income tax return annually. The Village of Swanton contracts with the Regional Income Tax Authority (R.I.T.A) to administer income tax collection. Income tax returns are due April 15, 2019. Please submit your income tax return electronically at <u>www.ritaohio.com</u> or mail completed Form 37. Mailing addresses vary based on balance due or refund.





Taxpayers that have moved outside of the village limits or are a retired person receiving only retirement income, must notify RITA by completing an Individual Declaration of Exemption Form located at https://cdn.ritaohio.com/Media/700801/ <u>exemption-form.pdf</u>. Otherwise, RITA will continue to expect an income tax return and the taxpayer will be considered delinquent.
