Downtown Façade Enhancement Program

Swanton Village Council approved a \$30,000 allocation in the proposed 2020 budget to launch the inaugural Downtown Façade Enhancement Program. This program will allow eligible businesses, or property owners, to apply for a 50% grant, up to \$10,000, for an enhancement to the outside of their buildings; certain restrictions apply. Those interested should contact the Village Administrator for more information.

Memorial Park Pavilion Renovations

Renovations are almost complete at the Memorial Park Pavilion. Village Council awarded the contract to the Dotson Company and their crews are working on the final stages of the project. New concrete floor, new doors, new roll up shutters, new ceiling façade, addition of a fireplace, and a new paint job are all included in the renovations. The Village is grateful for the over \$95,000 in grant funding towards this project. Final project estimate is approximately \$146,000.

2019 Tree Plantings

North Branch Nursery will once again plant trees throughout the Village. This year the focus areas include streets where trees have been removed: Lincoln, Chestnut, and Clark. All residents near the new trees will receive information soon.

2020 Infrastructure Projects

2020 will be a busy year for infrastructure projects in the Village of Swanton. Look forward to more information on the Downtown Business Alley Improvement and the Project 10 Sewer Separation project.

Adopt a Bench Program

Earlier this year, the Village of Swanton unveiled an Adopt a Bench Program for Rotary and Pilliod Parks. Eight new benches were placed along the paths in each of these parks. Community members and organizations already adopted six out of the eight benches. Plaques will be installed to memorialized these sponsorships. THANK YOU! Brush Pick Up



Leaf Pick Up

Brush pick up will commence on October 7, 2019 and run until October 31, 2019. There will be no weekly brush pick up from November 1, 2019 to April 5, 2020 UNLESS there is a storm which warrants the pick up. Brush pick up is divided into sections with each section having pick up on a different day (listed below with leaf info).

Leaf pick up will commence the week of October 28, 2019 and run through December 9, 2019. If snow were to fall another pick up would be scheduled after snow melts. The Village of Swanton contracts with Lammon Brothers to collect leaves. Lammon Brothers collects leaves according to the respective area. Areas are as follows: north of railroad tracks and west of Main Street on Monday, north of railroad tracks and east of Main Street on Tuesday, south of railroad tracks and west of Main Street on Wednesday, and south of railroad tracks and east of Main Street on Thursday. All dates are approximate. Holidays, weather, events, breakdowns and day to day operations may cause adjustments to the schedule.

Please place leaves on the tree lawn for collection, NOT in the street. Leaves placed in the street can be a hazard to motorists, can block drainage, and become wet and matted after a rain, which can significantly slow the collection process. Please do not mix grass, sticks, or brush in with the leaves.

Need Assistance Raking Leaves?

Members of the Interact Club at Swanton High School are volunteering their services to rake leaves for those in the Swanton community who need assistance. There are a few stipulations such as time limit and boundary the students will stay within. If you have specific questions please contact the Village and we will connect you with the students. There is a sign up sheet at the Municipal Building for those who are interested. Coordination of raking leaves will be between the Interact Club and the resident. The Village of Swanton will not be a party to the service.

Open Burning Regulations

Take only cash and credit cards you need when shopping

- 2. Never leave food cooking on your stove top or in the oven unattended
- 3. Keep candles away from combustible materials and extinguish all candles before leaving the room

This event is run by volunteers and preparation is



- cleaning wipes of any kind


- facial tissue

Mercury in Households

Did you know that in 2007, the State of Ohio passed House Bill 443, which included bans on mercury use? The

sale of mercury-containing thermometers, thermostats and novelty items are banned in Ohio.

If you still have items which contain mercury please do not flush them. Although you can legally throw household products that contain mercury into the trash, it is better to recycle them or send them to a licensed household hazardous waste facility. Mercury and products that contain metallic mercury, including thermostats, batteries, thermometers and fluorescent lights, can be safely recycled. Homeowners can search the Earth911 website to find local recyclers in their area.



Village of Swanton's New Payment Service Offers More Choices for Customers

The Village will provide utility customers with easy access to make payments and more payment options. The



easier to pay your bill on the go with a mobile optimized payment site schedule a payment

Village has implemented an advanced electronic billing and payment solution. Online account access payments were previously offered, but now customers can choose to pay with electronic check or a credit or debit card and additionally gain the ability to pay by phone or text message.

The new service brings a user-friendly online payment portal We have made it enabling customers to view and pay bills, schedule one-time payments, securely store payment information for later use, review up to 24 months of past bills (as they become available), enroll paperless notifications are sent when the bill is ready to view, just before and the ability to the due date and when a scheduled payment is pending. Creating an account is recommended, however, it is not necessary to view bills and make a payment.

The pay by phone option is available 24/7 and is a quick alternative for customers who may not be interested in going online. Customers can simply call <u>877-493-5091</u> anytime, enter their account information and follow the prompts to make a payment or get their latest account balance. With Pay by Text, customers can stay informed by receiving text notifications about their bill and additionally have the option to respond via text message to make a payment using their default payment method. Meter Replacement Policy


Meters are the property of the Village of Swanton. The property owner owns the pipes and valves on either side of the meter. The property owner is responsible to protect the meter serving their property and the structures on their property which are supplied water from the utility. Upon notification there may be something wrong with a meter, the Village of Swanton will investigate and install a new meter if needed, provided the premise is meter ready.

- If the Village of Swanton deems a meter malfunctioned, the Village of Swanton will replace the meter at no charge.
- If the Village of Swanton has reasonable cause to claim the reason for replacement is negligence on the property owner or that the meter was either vandalized, tampered with, or lost in service the Village will assess a meter replacement fee on the utility account.
- If the Village of Swanton deems the meter is frozen, the Village will provide the first replacement at no charge and noted on the account. If the same account is flagged for a second frozen meter, the Village will assess a meter replacement fee on the utility account. The replacement fee will include materials, supplies, and labor.
