Personnel Report

1. Hiring

- a. One of the three emergency hires that Chief Schaffer approved, Brian Groves, has determined he does not have adequate time to give to the fire and rescue division.
- b. Do to Mr. Groves's unavailability Chief Schaffer would like to recommend hiring Andrew Lovingood in normal hiring manner.
 - i. Mr. Lovingood is an EMT only but has restarted Firefighter I school in the last few weeks. His is scheduled to complete Firefighter I the end of June, 2020.
 - ii. If approved the recommendation would be for an agreement between the Village of Swanton and Mr. Lovingood to illustrate the need for him to provide documentation of his complete of FFI course.
 - iii. Chief Schaffer would recommend his pay be less than a FF/EMT. \$13 dollars per hour until he receives FF I certification at which time it would go up to \$15.00 per hour.
 - c. Move to approve the hiring of Andrew Lovingood as a part time member of the Fire Division, effective June 14, 2020 at an hourly rate of \$13.00/hour contingent on successful completion of background check and drug screen. Mr. Lovingood is subject to a 6-month introductory period effective June 14, 2020. Further, Mr. Lovingood must submit a letter, no later than August 3, 2020, from the State of Ohio illustrating completion Ohio Firefighter I certification. Upon receipt of said letter, Mr. Lovingood's wage will be increased to \$15.00 /hour at the beginning of the next full paid period after the date of the letter.
