 - South side of Brookside Drive from Hallett Avenue to Crestwood Drive

2. Project Updates

- a. Project 10 Sewer Separation
 - i. Walk through with contractor and engineer on September 23
 - ii. List of items which need follow up
 - iii. One year warranty period
- b. Project 8 & 9 Sewer Separation

- i. Engineers reviewing the camera footage of lines which will help with design
- c. Business & Dodge Alleys
 - i. Wrapping up underground work

3. Bulk Drop Off Day

- a. Over 130 properties utilized services
 - i. Over 30 of those with multiple trips

4. Utility Billing Credit

- a. Council approved moving forward with offering a one-time credit on utility bills for those who sign up for ACH and/or paperless billing
- b. The credit is paid for through the funding received from HB481
- c. Since the funds can only be used for programs and initiatives from March 1-October 15, 2020, only those who have signed up since March 1 and through September 29 will qualify
 - i. The September 30 deadline will allow processing on the Village's end to reflect on the bill due October 15, 2020

5. Fulton County Regional Planning

- a. Met on September 24 to discuss Comprehensive Plan and Tammy Richardson's retirement plan
- b. Many other entities desire to have work session of the FCRP to discuss proposed updates to Comprehensive Plan

6. Municipal Building Office Hours

- a. Over the summer months, Mrs. Hoelzle has spent time reviewing operations at the Municipal Building. She also created a survey for the public to provide input on service provision.
- b. With both of these things in mind, as well as conversations with Staff, effective Monday October 5, 2020 the Municipal Building hours of operation will change to 7:30 a.m. -4:00 p.m.
- c. This will continue to be monitored. If the change causes negative consequences, it may be subject to change again in 2021.

7. 2020 Census

a. Stay tuned for final date information as there have been some last minute activities

- A federal court has ordered the Trump administration to abandon lastminute changes to the 2020 Census schedule and extend the time for counting for an additional month.
- ii. The preliminary injunction issued Thursday September 24 by U.S. District Judge Lucy Koh in the Northern District of California requires the Census Bureau to keep trying to tally the country's residents through Oct. 31.
- b. Census workers are knocking on doors for those who have not responded
 - i. This is called nonresponse follow-up (NRFU)
- c. Village of Swanton response when NRFU began on 8/9/2020: 73.8%
- d. Total response rate as of 9/24/2020: 76.9%
- e. Total from 2010 for Village of Swanton was 76.6%
