## Looking Forward to 2021

2020 was a year like no other. As with many of you, the Village of Swanton had to make quick changes in response to the pandemic. Village officials are proud of the work accomplished in 2020 and look forward to 2021.

The upcoming year will be filled with initiatives and projects to continue the momentum of progress in the Village. The Village received a proposal from a firm to work on a comprehensive master plan for the Water Resource Recovery Facility. This plan will provide data and information in order to make informed decision on future upgrades at the plant. This is vital as many projects can amass a price tag of over \$1 million. Village officials con-

tinue to be conscious of fiscal stewardship and will continue to compile the information before making those decision to ensure services are provided at an exceptional rate. Further in 2021, there will be another sewer separation project as part of the Long Term Control Plan. This project will center on Mettabrook, Allen, West, Sanderson, and parts of Browning and W. Garfield. As preliminary design is complete, please stay tuned for public information meetings.



Village Council approved moving forward with installing a membrane system at the Water Treatment Plant. This project will begin in earnest in 2021 with estimated final completion in 2022. Village officials believe this project will add to the quality of water treated and distributed by the Village of Swanton.

Village officials anticipate proposals, from qualified firms, to assist with updating Title XV: Land Usage of the Codified Ordinances. This centers on the zoning code, subdivision regulations, and flood damage prevention. This is paramount to ensure the Village has regulations that are in line with current trends.

Finally, there will be updates through the Safe Routes Through School grant program. Most aspects of this project center on installing sidewalks in areas leading towards schools. There will also be updated signage as well as z-gates at the railroad grade crossing on Main Street.

Village officials are committed to continued progress and 2021 is sure to include many great advances.

## Utility Meter Upgrades

As with many other pieces of equipment, there is an industry standard for utility meters; this standard is typically between 10-20 years for water meters. After that period of time, it is recommended meters are replaced to ensure correct usage is calculated. This is vital to water accountability. Each month, the Village compares water produced to water usage billed; this percentage is referred to as water accountability. Currently the Village averages 80% accountability which is an improvement over last year's rate. Village Officials continue to identify areas where water loss could occur and malfunctioning meters, which are passed the industry standard benchmark, are up for replacement. Phase 1 of the project occurred in 2020; phase 2 will occur in 2021. If you are a Village resident receiving Village water and you did not have a new water meter installed in 2020, please be on the look out for more information to come your way on scheduling in mid 2021.

## Swanton Village Brush Pick Up 2021 Schedule

Brush pick up will begin on April 5, 2021and continue WEEKLY until April 29, 2021.

MONTHLY brush pick up will occur from May 10, 2021 to September 17, 2021 on the 2nd Monday of each month.

WEEKLY brush pick up will start up again from October 4, 2021 until October 28, 2021.

NO WEEKLY brush pick up from October 29, 2021 to April 3, 2022 UNLESS there is a storm which warrants the pick up.

The Village is divided into four sections to correspond to one day of the week. During April and October, each section will be picked up four (4) times; once per week.

Monday: North of railroad tracks and West of Main Street. Tuesday: North of railroad tracks and East of Main Street. Wednesday: South of railroad tracks and West of Main Street. Thursday: South of railroad tracks and East of Main Street

Brush pick up, provided by the Village of Swanton, is for fallen tree limbs not for clearing of lots or removal of entire trees



## No Wipes in the Pipes

The Public Works Department (spanning a couple Divisions) has spent much time in 2020 working on clogged pumps in the wastewater collections system. Most of the clogs are caused by wet wipes; these could be cleaning wipes (Clorox, Lysol, etc.) or "flushable" wipes used to clean yourself or your children. Please understand these wipes do no disintegrate when flushed. If you are looking for a New Year's resolution, think about what \*\*not\*\* to flush to keep the wastewater collections system flowing properly and preventing backups!

## Mass Notification System

Since July 2019, the Uillage of Swanton has used the CivicReady system, through Fulton County, to send out mass notification messages through email, phone calls, and texts.

There are two notification groups for the VIllage of Swanton: General notifications and Boil Advisory notifications. Haven't joined yet? The quickest way is through Text to Join.

Text 30890, and in the message type Join SwantonGeneral or Join SwantonBoil (it is case sensitive and there needs to be a space between Join and the keyword).

Daylight Savings Time begins at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday March 14. Please remember to move your clocks ahead one hour. It is also recommended to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms on this day.



### Winter is Coming



We ask everyone to be aware of the workers plowing snow. If there is snow and ice, please remember to take it slow and allow enough room between you and the plow. Further, throughout snowfalls, of more than 3 inches, removing parked cars from the street allows for a more efficient snow removal per Section 73.05 of the Codified Ordinances. Further per Section 95.12 illustrates the duty to remove snow from sidewalks and around fire hydrants within 24 hours of its accumulation.

To avoid clearing your driveway entrance repeatedly, wait until the plow trucks have completely cleared the roadway curb to curb. Please do not shovel or plow snow into the streets. Please do not pass a snowplow truck.

Each truck has blind spots that reduce side and rear visibility. If you cannot see their mirrors, then they cannot see you. Increase the following distance between your vehicle and others. Also allow for safe distances between your vehicle and a salt truck to reduce the chance of loose materials striking your car and to give you more time to react to sudden stops.





All residents of the Village of Swanton, age 18 and older, with earned income are required to file a Village income tax return annually. The Village of Swanton contracts with the Regional Income Tax Authority (R.I.T.A) to administer income tax collection. Please note that many of the self-preparation software programs such as Turbo Tax DO NOT e-file Village income tax return. If you self-prepare your taxes, please make sure you e-file your Village tax return at <a href="https://www.ritaohio.com">www.ritaohio.com</a>.
