## Resolution 2022-24

A RESOLUTION CERTIFYING TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR AN ASSESSMENT AND LIEN UPON 234 NORTH MAIN STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF SWANTON FULTON COUNTY, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village of Swanton has the right to abate nuisances should a property owner not abate such nuisance within the time stated in the notice given pursuant to law;

WHEREAS, Ohio law provides that the failure to pay the charges imposed shall constitute and result in a lien upon the property in question; and

WHEREAS, certain property owners have not paid the fee and, therefore, are to be assessed the fee on their property taxes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SWANTON, FULTON COUNTY OHIO, THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. The amount set forth in the attached Exhibit A is hereby certified to the Auditor of Fulton County, Ohio, as a lien and assessment upon the property described therein, with such amount to be placed upon the tax rolls collected as in the case of other taxes and assessments.

<u>Section 2</u>. It is found and determined that all formal actions of Council concerning or relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the Village of Swanton and the State of Ohio.

<u>Section 3</u>. This resolution is deemed an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to place this upon the tax duplicate.
