Village of Swanton Residential Government Aggregation Program Discount on Electric Bill Available Through Swanton's Governmental Aggregation Program

Residents and small businesses in the Village of Swanton have the opportunity to save money on their electric bills through the community's electric aggregation program.

By participating in this program, residents and small businesses will pay 6.96 ¢/kwh. According to state law, local communities are allowed to bring their citizens together to buy electricity as a group and negotiate the terms, conditions and price of the electric supply on the group's behalf. This type of group buying power has proven to be an effective way to obtain a lower electricity price for all the group members. Swanton voters approved governmental aggregation in May 2010. Energy Harbor was selected as the community's electric generation supplier. Toledo Edison will continue to be responsible for the delivery of power to homes and businesses, and will continue to read meters, maintain poles and wires and restore power after an outage.

 The early planning stages of this project began in the beginning of 2021 and the construction phase began at the end of February 2023. The purpose of this project is to remove the Lime Softening
