

Capital Improvements

2024 First Half Year Hot Topics:

Sewer Separation Project 3, 11 & 12: The separation is nearing completion in the “Tree Streets” north of the railroad tracks. Paving and clean up will begin within the next few months, then the crews will move out to Airport Hwy. & South Main St. to begin the last phase in this project.

Munson Road: Reconstruction and Sewer Extension work is still in the design phase. Bids for construction have not been advertised. We are waiting on final design plans from the engineer. Hoping to award construction this summer.

Hallett Reconstruction/Resurfacing from Airport Hwy. to Chestnut St.: Advertisement bids for construction should be coming up in May with an award at the end of June.

Klumm Bros. Waste Solutions is now the Village Refuse & Recycling provider. Please see the calendar provided within this newsletter. Recycling week is based on which side of the tracks you reside in.

We are working on estimates for various alleys and parking lots downtown off Main St.

Crack Sealing will be taking place this summer as well as on various roads throughout the Village.

Friendly Reminders:

Brush pick-up: Occurs the 2nd Monday of every month from April-October. What defines brush? Anything the naturally has fallen from a tree, which means NOT CUT LIMBS (trimming of trees that are not in the right of way is the residents responsibility and so is the clean-up). **Brush is sticks only. If combined with leaves and weeds, the pile will not be picked up.** Also, please be patient as the truck we normally use is in the shop getting repairs done. We are working on getting a brush bin for residents to be able to utilize/take brush to. This will be monitored with a security system as dumping anything other than brush will be considered illegal dumping.

Trash: Village dumpsters ARE NOT FOR RESIDENTIAL GARBAGE. These dumpsters are for Village Departments and event use only. If caught illegally dumping, you will be prosecuted.

Housekeeping Items

Brush Pick Up Schedule

Brush pick up will be the 2nd week of the month between April and October.

Brush pick up is provided by the Village of Swanton. It is the Public Service Superintendent that decides what is considered a reasonable amount of brush. **Brush is sticks only. If combined with leaves and weeds, the pile will not be picked up. The Village WILL NOT pick up brush from clearing of trees.**

Whether you're planting a tree, shrub or garden, aerating your yard, installing a mailbox or building a fence or deck, contacting **OHIO811** before you dig protects your home and your family. Avoid potential injury, property damage, and utility disruption.

Be CivicReady!

Sign up to receive messages from the Fulton County mass notification system. These messages include General Notifications, Boil Advisory, and Infrastructure Project notifications.

Simply text 30890 and in the message type **Join SwantonGeneral**, **Join SwantonBoil** or **Join SwantonProjects** (they are case sensitive and there needs to be a space between Join and Swanton).

DO NOT FLUSH!

- Disposable diapers
- Tampons/tampon applicators
- Sanitary napkins
- Cottonballs/swabs
- Cleaning wipes of any kind
- Facial tissue
- Bandages/bandage wrappings
- Automotive fluids
- Paint, solvents, sealants, or thinners
- Hazardous/poisonous waste
- Cooking grease, oil or fat

Please be cautious of what you flush. Many wipes claim to be "flushable" but are NOT. The items listed above as well as the "flushable" wipes wreak havoc on our sewer collection systems.
